The objective of this course is to help clinicians and school personnel optimize the social, emotional, and behavioral well-being of children and adolescents at school. As a result of attending this program, you will be able to identify and resolve the gaps/problems in practice needed to promote learning, resiliency, and social and emotional growth, as well as to support and enhance collaboration among students, administrators, mental health professionals, and family members. You will be able to describe ways to assess and intervene with students exhibiting a wide range of maladaptive behaviors, including violence, bullying, cyberbullying, and other high-risk actions. Through lectures, panel discussions, and questions and answers, learners will be able to identify how to: obtain better social and communication skills in students on the spectrum; manage complex legal and ethical dilemmas in the school; work with students who exhibit signs of serious mental illness; help with issues confronting LGBT students; and understand children and families from diverse backgrounds. This course is intended for mental health and health clinicians, **all** school personnel, researchers, and others interested in the well-being of students.
