COVID Criteria for Testing

Must have new fever, cough, or new or worsening shortness of breath AND

- 2. Be CHA patients AND
- 3. Be over the age of 18 **AND**
- 4. Must meet at least one of the following criteria (in any subgroup):
 - a. Special populations:
 - i. Health care workers including employees of group homes and nursing homes
 - ii. First responders
 - iii. People experiencing homelessness
 - iv. Pregnant women in the 3rd trimester pre-delivery (note: per protocol, do not need to be symptomatic)
 - b. Risk factors for complications and hospitalization:
 - i. Adults <u>></u> 65
 - ii. Patients with pulmonary disease (asthma, COPD, ILD, bronchiectasis, CF, etc.)
 - iii. Immunosuppressed patients (patients with active cancer, solid organ transplant, immunosuppressive medications, HIV)
 - iv. Patients with heart disease (congenital heart disease, coronary artery disease, heart failure)
 - v. Patients with diabetes, CKD or ESRD, HTN, or cirrhosis
 - vi. Patients with sickle cell disease
 - vii. Morbidly obese patients (BMI \geq 40)
 - viii. Patients with neurodevelopmental or neurological disease (prior stroke, spinal cord injury, ALS, multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy), dementia, or cognitive impairment
 - ix. Pregnant women who are symptomatic
