PALLIATIVE CARE

For patients who aren't ready for hospice care, but are experiencing advanced illness, palliative care adds a layer of assistance for families and providers. Our palliative care medical team makes recommendations to relieve the pain, symptoms and stress that often accompany serious illness. In partnership with patients' primary care physicians and specialists, we create personalized care plans that meet every need. This collaboration reduces hospital admissions and improves quality of life.

PALLIATIVE CARE TEAM

Our palliative care interdisciplinary team includes physicians board certified in hospice and palliative care, nurse practitioners and social workers. We work with each patient's primary care physician and specialist to offer seamless care.



REASONS FOR PALLIATIVE CARE

Appropriate at any age and stage in a serious illness, whether curable, chronic or life-threatening, palliative care can help with:

- Complex pain and symptom management
- Diagnosis and prognosis discussions, especially when prognosis may be unclear
- Discussions relating to a patient's goals of care
- Advanced care planning
- Care and treatment issues that affect quality of life

Palliative care enhances daily life for people with:

- Cancer (any stage)
- Dementia/Alzheimer's disease
- Respiratory disease (COPD/emphysema)
- Cardiac disease, heart failure, stroke
- Kidney or liver failure
- Multiple Sclerosis

PALLIATIVE CARE BENEFITS

Palliative care from Care Dimensions offers multiple benefits:
