Applications are now being accepted for the Program for Psychotherapy Fellowship. The fellowship focuses on long-term psychodynamic psychotherapy with adults.

The social work fellowship is a two year outpatient program of 40 hours per week consisting of 20 patients, 4 hours of individual supervision, 1 hour of supervision group, 1 hour of reading seminar (the first year, readings on theory and technique of psychodynamic psychotherapy; the second year, readings on object relations theory beginning with Freud and concluding with contemporary theorists), 5 hours of research, 7 hours of paperwork/collateral work/consultation, 1.25 hour of grand rounds, .25 hours per week (once a month) of a precepting meeting, .5 hours per week (every other week) of a social work fellows professional development meeting, and 1 hour a week of an all fellows meeting (which at various times includes administrative issues, in-service training, a discussion with a senior faculty member, and the PFP case conference). Optional seminars/supervision groups are also offered. The fellowship begins August 30, 2019. Stipend each year: \$32,000.

If you are interested in applying to the fellowship, please make **two** application packets containing each of the following **to be received in our office** by Friday, February 8, 2019:

- your c.v.
- a letter of intent explaining your interest in the fellowship
- a written summary of a psychotherapy case which represents your clinical thinking and your clinical work, including the course of treatment (there is no minimum or maximum length; the important thing is that it shows your clinical thinking and work)
- three letters of recommendation (If you are not a current intern at CHA, please send three letters of recommendation **PLUS** a statement from the Director of Training at your site which includes verification that you are in good standing). Please emphasize to your recommenders the importance of their letters being received by the application deadline.

We will not begin reviewing application materials until the day after the application deadline.

Please send one packet to Dr. Rebecca Drill and one packet to Dr. Jack Beinashowitz. They both have the same address: Macht Building, Program for Psychotherapy, Cambridge Health Alliance, 1493 Cambridge Street, Cambridge, MA 02139 re: PFP Fellowship. **PLEASE DO NOT SEND APPLICATION MATERIALS IN SUCH A WAY THAT REQUIRES A SIGNATURE UPON RECEIPT**, as neither recipient is readily available to receive deliveries and this will delay delivery of your application.

For each packet, you should send all your materials in one mailing. The only items that can be sent separately are the letters of recommendation. You can send these letters in one of two ways: either include the letters in your packet (in which case, each letter must be in its own sealed envelope with the recommender's signature over the seal) or supervisors can mail letters in on their own (in which case one envelope must be addressed to Dr. Drill and one to Dr. Beinashowitz).

Please note for international students: we are unable to sponsor visas.
